It is with heavy hearts that we announce the passing of Brian Daniel Peddle of Halifax, NS on 13 December 2024 at the Halifax Infirmary.

He was born on July 22nd, 1951 to Ruth and Leo Peddle in Halifax NS.

After graduation from St. Patrick's High School, Brian began a career in sales, working first for Farmer's Dairy in Halifax under the tutelage of his father. From there he moved to Kentville and was employed over a number of years in sales, first McCain Foods, then CM McLean Ltd followed by Domtar Packaging. He moved next to what was probably his favourite job, working as a cook on the Rowan Gorilla oil rigs. He was later employed by the town of Kentville and went on to be a Town Councilor. His last employment was driving a school bus in the Prospect Bay area where he loved and was loved by his passengers.

Brian was an avid hockey fan (Go Bruins!), having played hockey in one form or another for much of his life. He was one of the well-known Corner Boys at the Kentville arena, attending any and all hockey games. On Sundays he could be found playing ball hockey with his son Sean, the Wood family and other regulars of all ages. When not at the arena, Brian could be found in one garage or another talking of cars with friends or cheering on Richard Boyd's car at the stock car races. Brian became well known in later life for his poetry,

recognizing the many wonderful nurses that tended to him with such kindness and empathy over the years. Family and friends were very important to Brian and his calls will surely be missed.

Brian is survived by a son, Sean Peddle and a daughter, Sarah Peddle (Greg MacEwen), two brothers, Gary Peddle (Susan) and Trevor Peddle (Pauline), and two sisters, Judy Ryan (Carey) and Sheila Kay (Larry) along with numerous beloved nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his parents, Ruth and Leo Peddle.

As per Brian's request, there will be no service or celebration of life except for some private family gatherings. Unlike the way he lived his life, loving to be the centre of attention, Brian wanted to go quietly.
