In 2017 she was diagnosed with breast cancer which after surgery and chemo she returned to work. After her time at the IWK, she did a year contract at Dalhousie before we got the unfortunate news that her cancer had spread in 2020. During her lengthy battle, she did not let her illness slow her down, she got to see and do so much. She saw Gaby graduate from high school, Lena finish Junior high and start High School and watched Lena take her first drive down the street from the window. She went to Mexico, the Dominican, Scotland, and Portugal just to name a few of her non-Canadian adventures. She loved touring Scotland with her brother Colin, seeing a real castle was one of the items on her bucket list. Within Canada she got to go to Alberta and see Lake Louise, the Rocky Mountains and meet Joan's family and Sam's aunt Barbara. She took many day trips and weekend adventures. I know you

didn't get to the Cabot Trail Cindy, but I promise we're going to take you there in 2024. Cindy loved her family, and her friends. She was the most generous person you could meet. She was always the first one to volunteer when you needed something. She even volunteered when you didn't know you needed something. She was truly a guardian angel here on earth to so many.

Cremation has taken place, and a celebration of life will take place in the New Year.
