With a passion for mother nature, Lee transformed the Meisner property with majestic gardens that thrived, along with a beautiful greenhouse that he had completed building within the last year. He had a connection with nature, communicating with his beloved crow visitors Chuckie and Charlotte while working in his gardens. His son Sam refers to him as 'The Greatest Father In The World' and is forever grateful for all of the wonderful moments they shared together. 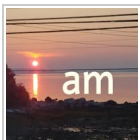

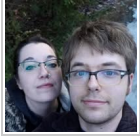
