With much shock and sadness we announce the passing of Rob. Husband, brother (in-law), uncle and buddy to many. Not a husband to many, there was just Andrea!

Robert was born into an Air Force family in Cold Lake, Alberta, moving around both inside and outside the country. It inspired him to get his pilot's license when he was a young man. He was a life-long traveller and he and Andrea went on many adventures together, with Cuba being most dear to his heart. Robert had a career driving trucks; courier, freight and home heating oil. He knew every corner of Halifax. He spent a large part of his career driving for Sameday, where Andrea worked dispatch. There he made many fast friends. Many times he acted as our personal mover and delivery man.

And then there is the Wednesday night boys! What started as a cheap steak and beer at a local pub became a weekly games night at Robert's. Thousands of games of pool, washer toss, shuffleboard (homemade by the gang), ping-pong were played and thousands upon thousands of records spun. Belly laughs too numerous to mention. This was a very special gang of ex-Greenwood 'boys'. Some came and went over the years, but at its' core were Robert, Steve, Donald, Danny, Michael, Greg and Judy.

Lake Pleasant, aka 'the Lake', was a place where the McFarland clan and entourages, gathered most summer weekends. There was always something on the go. Structures to repair, build, tear down, rebuild. Rob was a hard guy to get to sit down and do nothing....unless it was sitting in his kayak. He and

Andrea spent many, many hours exploring the Lake and many other lakes around the province. The after supper campfire was legendary. Robert liked to stoke it higher and later than necessary and then sneak off to bed, despite the rule that whomever added the last piece of wood stayed up with the fire. He also liked to serenade us with many tunes, with a favourite being Gordon Lightfoot...any song. Name it and he knew the words.

Robert was a devoted Montreal Canadiens and Saskatchewan Roughriders fan. He played hockey all his life until he couldn't. He played softball for many years with Sameday.

Robert is survived by his wife of 35 years and partner in bad puns, Andrea MacDonald. His sisters Laurie St. Amour and Karen (Donald) Dodge, brother Michael and his other brother Steve Gaudet. He was a loving, fun and active uncle to Erin (Alan Slipp) Gaudet, Coco Gaudet, Angeline (Amy Pyne) St. Amour, Jane (Eric) Hamilton and Sam (Arissa) Dodge. 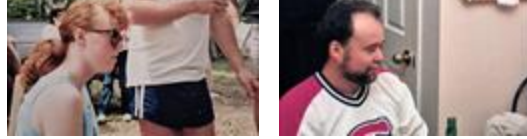

I met Rob when the McFarlands were posted to Greenwood from Shearwater, 1972 or '73. He was standing on the sidelines while about a dozen or so of us were playing tackle football in the field by the Rec Centre the (no pads, no refs, a rag or something to mark where you had to get to for a first down) and I walked over and asked him if he wanted to play. We're all air force brats, know the feeling too well of being the new kid. Of course he did. I counted heads, and the other team needed an extra guy, make it seven vs. seven, so I said go join those guys. Tackled him two plays later. Two or three plays later, he tackled me. Like, hard. I got up and he kind of tensed in case I was going to take umbrage, (and put up the dukes), and I just laughed and said "Nice tackle, what's your name?" Been tight ever since.

West Kings High, drinking underage by Zeke's Creek, Valley Barons Jr. C hockey team (he was our trainer, ran the back gate), him coming to B.C. to hook up with me for work, mad ride with a friend of a friend in a station wagon with bald tires in snowy conditions through the Rockies, dropped off at Greyhound station in Calgary to make it to Edmonton (we both had rucksacks, I was also carrying a garbage bag with our unwashed laundry, and he yells across the terminal "Hey you, with the Newfoundland suitcase, hurry up, bus is leaving!" Everybody stared, I still remember the blushing), jobs in Edmonton we would quit, he couldn't wait to get back Down Home. I ended up Down Home again, and through the years, so many good times. The lake. Him in the powerboat with the honkin' big outboard towing us waterskiing. Sitting around the fire. Kids growing up under our feet. Wednesday night events. One could never meet a better man, nor have a better friend. Farewell buddy, smooth sailing. Malcolm

Hugs and strength to you all. Goodbye Rob...

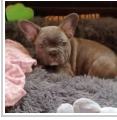

“ I met Robert (that's his family name), I called him Rob, Back in grade 10 at West Kings.

Rob was a short stocky little guy & had a little weight room in his dads garage. I remember I was at his place in Greenwood one Summer & we were about 16. Here we were, 2 shorts guys in the garage lifting weights to build up our muscles. We both knew that we couldn't control how tall we were going to get, but we can determine how thick we got....this one Saturday we were having a weight lifting competition, to see how much weight we could lift over our head using one arm.

I never really tried doing this before, but was up for the challenge. I quickly realized that I might have bitten off more than I could chew

1. The extra 2 inches in height was not an advantage when lifting weights over your head.

2. The balancing act involved when lifting over your head with only one arm.

3. This was not Rob's 1st time doing this

4. I quickly realized that Rob was a strong MF, as I struggled as we got up in weight & he was still clean & jerking the weight with ease.....

I was shocked & saddened by his death. I feel very fortunate to have seen Rob the Mon before, when he was in the hospital. I was leaving the country on Tue & told him to stay strong & I would see him in the spring. I didn't realize I would not.

I was also a member of this Wed nite crew for quite a while off & on over the years. This kind of kinship to be sustained over the yrs, is a one of a kind opportunity & I am very grateful that Rob hosted this group of Merry men & has bonded us all, for the rest of our lives, as well as was a meeting place for out of towners...There were many, many special Hash Wednesday nites, lots of winners & losers, whether it be washer toss, pool, shuffleboard or ping pong.....

My condolences to Andrea who has lost her best friend & soul mate. To Laurie, Karen & Mike who have lost their best big brother.
