Mrs. Ruth Ann Harris Obituary

It is with sadness and remembrance that we announce the death of Ruth Ann Harris, age 90, who died peacefully with family by her side at daybreak February 21, 2026 in hospital after a brief illness .

Ruth Ann was born to Martha Elizabeth and Percy Lloyd Morse in Berwick, Nova Scotia, on April 11, 1935. She was the youngest of a large Annapolis Valley farm family and from an early age exhibited a great talent for music, pursuing vocal and piano studies at Acadia University, receiving a Bachelor of Music degree (1956), then continuing her training at the Opera School at the University of Toronto and subsequently at the Guildhall School of Music in London.

Widowed at a young age, family remained of utmost importance to her, raising five children while continuing to pursue vocal performance and teaching in Ontario and Nova Scotia.

Prior to the onset of dementia in recent years, she continued to share music with other seniors at her church and the local nursing home, bringing smiles and laughter to those who enjoyed her music.

She is survived by children Jonathan (Krista), Wally (Laura), Susan (Sergiu),

Thomas and stepdaughter Earlene Doucette (Neil).

In addition, she is survived by her brother Harold and by many adoring nephews, nieces and lifelong friends.

Preceded in death by husbands David Archibald (1922 -1975) and Emery Harris (1929 -2013), as well as her son Stuart (Janice) and stepson David.
