William Norman Lunn (Bill) of Lower Sackville, born in Dartmouth, NS August 1st, 1940 passed away peacefully with his three loving children by his side, April 18th 2023.

At a young age, Bill moved with his family to Glace Bay graduating from St. Michaels High School, later returning to his roots in Dartmouth and then Lower Sackville.

Bill retired after 35 years as a Civilian member of the RCMP where he received the Lieutenant Governors Award for his years of service. Bill loved to travel and shared that love with his family and friends. At age 61, he backpacked solo across Europe, staying in Hostels, to get the full experience. He met and made many friends during his frequent travels around the globe including Europe, Thailand, China, Greece, Portugal, Panama Canal, and across Canada and the United States. Often travelling with friends or joining with family members in one of his favorite places, Spain and in recent years Arizona.

Bill spent many years volunteering with 8th Sackville Cub Pack as Akela and 8th Sackville Scouts. After retirement he joined the Tartan Team at Halifax International Airport, providing Tours to School Groups and helping the traveling public from all over the world. He was all to happy to brag about how

fantastic Nova Scotia was. He also enjoyed working at the Metro Center, again greeting and meeting people for many years.

Survived by his family, Daughters Trish Lunn (Donald Hill) Brookfield, Kellie Lunn Lower Sackville, and Son William "Billy" Lunn (Karen).
